

STEP 1: Capturing your video

Importing From Your Digital Video Camera

- 1. Connect your camera to your computer (you'll need a FireWire cable)
- 2. Turn on the camera to the playback mode.
- 3. Use the **playback controls** to view the tape in the **iMovie monitor**. **Rewind** the tape to a few seconds before the section you want to import.
- 4. Click Play.
- 5. Click **Import** to start importing and click **Import** again to stop. Your new clip is now in the **Clips pane**.

Importing Media Already on Your Computer

- 1. Choose the **File** menu. Select **Import...**
- 2. Select the folder that has your video file. Click once on the file to select it.
- 3. Click on **Open**. You'll see the video file in the **Clips pane**.

Capturing a Still Image from Video

- 1. Drag the **Playhead** to the frame you want to capture.
- 2. Click on the Edit menu. Select Create Still Frame.
- 3. The image is placed in the Clips pane.

Importing an Image from iPhoto

- 1. Click the **Photos** button to switch to the **Photos pane**.
- 2. Choose an iPhoto album from the pull down menu.
- 3. **Uncheck** Ken Burns effect.
- 4. Use the **Duration slider** to set the clip's length.
- 5. Use the **Zoom slider** to make the image larger.
- 6. Click **Apply**. Your picture is at the end of the Timeline. Drag it to another location if you wish.



STEP 2: Editing your movie clips

Trimming Clips: Must be in Timeline viewer

- 1. Place your cursor at the beginning or end of the clip. The cursor turns into a horizontal arrow.
- 2. **Drag** the cursor to start the trim. Watch what's happening in the **Monitor** window.
- 3. Release your click and your clip is trimmed.

Splitting Media Clips: Can be in Timeline Viewer or Clips Pane

- 1. Drag the **Playhead** to the frame where you want to split the clip.
- 2. Click on the Edit menu.
- 3. Click on Split Video Clip at Playhead.
- 4. The clip will now appear as two clips.
- 5. If you want to restore the clip, click on it to select it. Click on the **Advanced** menu. Click on **Revert Clip to Original**. Click **OK**.

Moving/Reordering and Fading Media Clips

- 1. Select the clip on the **Timeline Viewer** or the **Clip Viewer**.
- 2. Click, hold, and drag the clip along the Timeline or Clip Viewer.
- 3. Release your click when your clip is where you want it.

Video Transitions in Clip Viewer

- 1. Click on the **Transitions** button below the **Shelf** to see the different transitions available.
- 2. Choose the transition you want. Set the **Speed** and **Directions**.
- 3. Click, hold, and drag the transition to the space between the 2 clips in the Clip Viewer.
- 4. Click on the **Play** button to view the transition in the **Monitor**.

Video Transitions in Timeline Viewer

Click on the **Transitions** button below the **Shelf** to see the different transitions available.

- 1. Choose the transition you want. Set the **Speed** and **Directions**.
- 2. **Click**, **hold**, and **drag** the transition to the space between the 2 clips in the **Timeline Viewer**.
- 3. Click on the **Play** button to view the transition in the **Monitor**



STEP 3: Adding audio

Recording Narration: *in Timeline View*

- 1. Click on the **Audio** button.
- 2. Drag the **Playhead** to the location where you want the narration to start.
- 3. Click on the **Record** button. iMovie plays the video while you record so you can time your narration to the movie.
- 4. Click the **Record** button again to stop recording. Your narration will appear in the **Timeline**.

Changing Volume: in Timeline Viewer

For individual audio tracks: Select the audio clip. Click on the **Speaker icon**. Drag the volume control slider at adjust the volume.

Fading Audio In and Out: in the Video track or Audio track

Click the **volume level bar** to create a new marker at the beginning or ending of the clip.

To fade in, drag the **beginning point** (square box) to the bottom left corner of the clip. To make the fade-in longer, drag the **yellow circle** to the right. The square box will also drag to the right. **Re-drag** the square box (the beginning point) back to the bottom left corner of the clip.

To fade out, drag the volume marker (yellow circle) to the bottom right corner of the clip.

Importing an Audio File from iTunes: in the Timeliner View

- 1. Click on the **Audio** button. You'll see your **iTunes library**.
- 2. Click the **pop-up menu** to choose an iTunes playlist.
- 3. **Drag** the song you want from the **Audio pane** into either audio track in the **Timeline**.

Importing an Audio File: in the Timeliner View

- 1. Drag the **Playhead** to the point where you want the audio clip to start.
- 2. Click on the **File** menu. Click on **Import...**
- 3. Choose the folder that contains the audio clip you want. Click on the clip to select it. Click on **Open**. Your audio file is now in the **Timeline**.



STEP 4: Add text to your movie and Save

Add Text: in the Storyboard

- 1. Click on the **Titles button** to bring up the **Titles pane**.
- 2. Choose a **Title Style** from the scrolling window.
- 3. Click once in a **Text Field**. Type your text.
- 4. Click on the **Preview** button to see your title in the **Monitor window**.

For **Text Color**

- 1. Click the rectangular **color field** below the titles list.
- 2. Choose a color from the color wheel.
- 3. Click on the **Preview** button to see your title in the **Monitor window**.
- 4. Click the color palette's red close button to finish the color process.

For **Text Font** and **Size**

- 1. Choose a font from the **Title Font** menu.
- 2. Drag the Title Text Size slider to increase and decrease the font size.
- 3. Click on the **Preview** button to see your title in the **Monitor window**.

To set the **Title Position/Animation**

- 1. Click on an arrow in the **directional controller** to specify the direction in which the text animates.
 - 2. Click in the **Preview window** to set the position. Set any other controls.
 - 3. Click on the **Preview** button to see your title in the **Monitor window**.

To set **Title Duration**

- 1. Drag the **Speed slider** to specify how long to complete the title's effect.
- 2. Drag the **Pause slider** to specify how ling the titles remain on screen.
- 3. Click on the **Preview** button to see your title in the **Monitor window**.

Adding Titles to your Movie

Drag the name of the Title Style onto the clip to which it will be applied in the **Timeline**. To modify the title, **select** the title clip, make your changes, and click the **Update** button.

Saving Your Project

To save the finished product, choose **File** and **Share...** Click on the **QuickTime** button. Choose **Full Quality** from the **Compress movie for:** menu. Select **Share**. Type a name for your movie. Choose a place to save your movie. Click **Save**.
